Objects of the Trust

- (a) The promotion of research relating to commercial horticulture in New Zealand in all its aspects including, without limitation, classification, propagation, culture, harvest, storage, processing, and marketing.
- (b) The dissemination of all results of that research for public benefit, and for the improvement of human knowledge.
- (c) The creation and protection of intellectual property arising from any such research with a view to maximising its benefits for the New Zealand economy and for the quality of life of persons living in New Zealand.
- (d) The promotion, and improvement, of training and education in New Zealand horticulture in all its aspects.
- (e) The promotion of, and support for and public dissemination of the results of research into, the development of tourist and export marketing synergies between New Zealand commercial horticulture and the New Zealand wine, dairy, sheep, cattle, pharmaceutical, nutrition, and tourism industries.
- (f) The establishment, and the support, of academic posts, scholarships, and prizes conducive to the attainment of any of the foregoing purposes.
- (g) The relief of illness and poverty among persons, and the families of persons, engaged, or formerly engaged, in activities and employment associated with commercial New Zealand horticulture.
- (h) Co-ordination of disaster relief and mitigation among persons, and the families of persons, engaged in activities and employment associated with commercial New Zealand horticulture.
